(Yeah, I know him.)

He lives out here at the county line, maybe. From Rogers County line you go north about a mile. That's on highway twenty towards Claremore.

(I'll try to find him. Swimmer Baldridge.)

Jack--of course he'd been dead a long time. You probably knowed him didn't he?

(Yes.)

I used to tell Swimmer if it hadn't been for Jack I would starved to death when I first went up to Chilocco. He worked in the bakery and they
