MORE ON HOW BUFFALO MEDICINE MEN DOCTORED

(Well, were the Indians living in tents and tipis then?)

Tipis and tents. Not too many tipis then because they had too many poles to carry. They used lighter equipment with just three poles with it--house tents. And most of them have canvas tents. Very few had tipis.

(I have another question. Now how were these buffalo medicine men dressed?)

Well, they dressed according to the way they supposed to have clothes. They didn't have no buckskin on there, but they had just regular kind of clothes. But they had paints on and equipment that they're supposed to have. They got their rattles and buffalo tails and paint on them. They sing. Mostly there was singing going on, and rattles--music. Jenny--you might ask Jenny what they did with that buffalo tail and rattles. She might tell you.

(Well, did they wear a blanket or anything?)

No. Some of them do, right around the waist. But they're equipped to get up and walk around. Once in a while one gets up and walks over there, goes through a ceremony and rattles and (shakes) feathers. I don't know too much about this buffalo medicine but
