one of the men furnished a one-seat buggy and one horse, and harness, and another man furnished another horse, and one man by the name of Otto Hunt volunteered to drive him up to Fonda. It was way after midnight. That's west of Canton (Fonda). Otto Hunt, Arapaho, drove. They left this dance there at midnight. The Cheyennes was gathering up there for their own purpose, but he got them in a bunch like he got these Arapahoes in a bunch here. July 1896.

(What was he like?)

Murphy? He was a little short stubby fellow. Round face, blocky. He always walked fast. He was a good speaker, I have to say that --smooth-talking.

(Did the Indians give him a name?)

vae eit -- "Shorty," or "Blocky."
