No where anything like that happened that summer. We didn't have no sun dance, and that's a pretty good event to put in." All right. They suggest. But he makes his own decision, what he thinks.

(Would there ever be any reason why a man might go to him and want to find out anything in particular like, maybe, what year he was born or something like that?)

Yes. Many go there. Many. Many go up there to find that. Something happen that year so they want it. Most of them, they want to know, and forgot their birthday, what year it was--what happened. And then he tell them.

(Can you remember any cases or any examples that you could tell me about people that did inquire about their age?)

I told you about Oliver and his wife....The social worker was doubting her age, when she was born. And she says they could prove it by the events of the Indian calendar. "Well, is it on record? Is it on paper?" "Yes." "Well, you go get it and show it to me." And they came over after it and Eddie didn't want them to have it but I said, "Oh, they'll bring it back." And I was the cause of it. And I loaned it to them. "Oh, we'll bring it back." And they took it and got everything fixed up and never did bring it back, and that was the end of it. We lost it.
