THE NAME TIAWAH

Was buried up there on that bald mound, and his name was Tiawah, and that's where it got it's name--Tiawah, some of them got mixed with Kiowa--

(Do they have any idea when he might have been buried up there--)

They claim they found the burial, the stone rock as a tomb or something, but I don't have any idea when it was done--my folks moved there about 1904.

(And it was before that--)

Yeah, before that and we had 400 acre ranch bout 2 miles south. My dad was cattle man. We came down here from Missouri (not clear)-- 30 when he died--that was just what I heard--(not clear) 19--let's see, we came here in 1902, and we lived out here on Dog Creek, and then we lived north, northeast of Tiawah, round the hill there. No, we lived north of Tiawah--then my dad--my dad moved there on that ranch about 1904 or '5, and the store started about that time, 'cause we traded there. I say they came from about 1904. I think it was '4. They lived in the back of the store, very small room, and they had a post office there--they hand the mail down from the train where they grabbed the mail sack, you know. Then he sold out--he had a daughter she was in Kansas, but she come on later.
