Mr. Journeyeake--he settled up there in Alluwee and then, Mr. Ed Campbell married one of the twins. And he put in a store at Alluwee. And all the prople, Mama used to go up there, 'bout once a week and they'd get their groceries. And then Claremore, as I said, started in '82. And then there was a little store they had over there, they called it Old Claremore. It was named from this Claremont.

Mr. Spruce--he was the--Juliet Spruce's father. They lived down around Tiawah. And now they could tell you, but there's none of them left. She was Mrs. Dyke Robinson. Dyke Robinson was court clerk at one time. And his wife was a Cherokee and she was a third cousin of Will Rogers. Her father and Liz Rogers were brother and sister.

LOCATION OF DOG CREEK

(Dog Creek comes right down here through Claremore, doesn't it?)

No, no it doesn't come through Claremore. But if you were going

to Pryor, the first creek there that you cross, is Salt Creek,

and it comes right around. And Cat Creek is on the west side.

Well, it was just along the creek--it's used to go along to Pryor.

The first creek, you go out here, and of course, there's a bridge over it now, and that Dog Creek kinda winds around and goes off toward Claremore.

(Yeah, there's lots of Indian families have given that as their first original home when they were small children, a long time ago. And some of them have Indian allotments, up and down Dog

Creek.)
