Yeah, they were all allotted, you know. But they are Omahas and these Omahas, like Bess Larrity and Bess Larrity is Omaha. She got relatives just like her. Married - recognized her. She said that woman - she got her - she looked like Omaha. Those Omahas look just like her - that Bess Larrity. So that was the way that was. So, it was quite a story. If a person could ever line it out - ever be - you know, all these things separate or make 'em fit some way - somebody just take the time to line 'em up that way - seem like it almost has to be done. Just like now, this Palmer - there ain't nobody knows about that. And I was surprised at Henry, he didn't know nothing about it. He didn't know nothing about it. I don't know who done it - but whoever done it, sure done a good thing. (laughter) And I thought he'd be the one to know.
