sell without cash. They know you get money all the time why they, well, it all depends and even though if you are working 6 days a week gettin' a paycheck they won't give you credit. You got more chance of getting credit if you got money out of the agency than if you knocking down 120 a week. check doesn't make any difference. They know they get their money if you get from agency. So it's quite a difference how Osages been treated. One time Harry Red Eagle checked prices and he found white man's lower, Indian's . price was higher. He said the Indian was charged higher. Whether it's still going on, well, we don't know. They used to talk about what they call-you look the word up discrimination and prejudice? Now that's what they have against Indian, You're Indian you play with a white boy go along, but what do the parents think about you, that's the question. Discriminate, you go along and you come around over here and you sit down, Indian will do that, maybe a white man won't. Can you go in a store and look around and touch something, maybe bounce basketball on the floor. You can do that, but the white man won't let you, white boy comes in well, he let him. He's going to let him touch that ball. We ought to remember that and try to, try to get along with people. Try to take care of yourself, keep clean. you talk, talk clean. The old Indian always say keep your body clean, dress nice. Some Indians they don't have the money to dress nice but keep--have your clothes clean even if they need patching. Keep yourself neat looking when you go among other people, older Indians say. Among own people it's alright. Behave yourself, keep your place, not like -- not in a sense keep your place again that's not talking like people from the south. say the colored man's got his own place to be. But I don't know, for the Indian it's not in a sense-like he has to take seat in the back of the bus things like that. Hold yourself back, don't be forward. Someone says come eat, don't be the first one to run to the table or something like that. People will tell you to come eat, sit here or something like that. Have good manners.
