(What is that big band, did you say?)

Big Chief.

(Big Chief?)

My grandpa, Archie his name (Osage name). My grandma's name is (Osage name). She was (Osage name) granddaughter. He had two daughters. Long time ago they used to marry the same man, sometimes you know, sisters, those days. My grandma had four children. The oldest one didn't have any children. There's two daughters, married to this same man. The older one had one son, that's Walter Matin's father. She's listed with my grandpa. The other daughter was my grandmother's mother. They belonged to the same band. But they were sisters, too, see. Same family name. Then she married a man. She had one son first--Simon Henderson, mama's brother and a sister. (not clear)--still her half brother too because they had the same father. It's Walter Matin's father. Then the fourth one was a son. Don't have his name but he married in the Big Hill. Grayhorse was his name.

(Is that called Big Hill?)

Uh-huh. Then the last son of (Osage name) was married to Louise Shunkamolah. They had two children, boy and a girl. The girl was that Mary James. The son was Roy James.. Mary James married Henry Roan. Their child was Grace Roan. She had the farm (not clear)-- But this fourth, youngest child, one that died. This youngest son was your, let's see, your great grandma was married to him, and that was his son's daughter. So that would make him your (not clear). (Laughter). His mother and Margaret, her mother
