Got too heavy and broke some of the limbs off.

(You stay out there much?)

Oh, we go out a morning and stay out all day - it's cooler - and the ceilings are high and the house is cool. And then they can go fishing or whatever they want to. They used to go fishing all the time. Somewhere in my family, must be on my father's side, they like to go fishing. You know Edna Kegley? She's my cousin. Our fathers were brothers. Her father was Peter Harvey, and mine was Luther Harvey. Lot of people don't know that. I had a brother named Peter Harvey. Yes, she's my cousin. And that's another thing, my mother, like I said there was old people, we would never know when it was our birthdays, but Edna's mother was a white woman, and she knows how old Minnie is. I guess my folks had a big family.

(I can remember you mother. Didn't she smoke cigars, go down Aunt Minnie and she'd be out there in the back, and she'd setting there just smoking a cigar?)

And she got to be real old, course we don't know how old, and she never was really watcha call helpless. She just got sick all at once. Something wrong
