That's what I was trying to say. Or an aunt...Yeah, they do that. I never had no aunt on my father's side. And then Minnie, she was not married to she's married to Louis James, but they quit - by the time my children started comin'. So we just got, well, Irvin was gonna a dance, and that's how come we came him. You know we have to call their names.

(He was drum keeper, wasn't he?)

Uh-huh. I raised 'em...never gave 'em to nobody to raise. Me and the kids, we lived out there quite awhile, alone, and then we moved in. And that's when their father died, when we moved in. We lived up there, where I said, you know. And then, when Bernice got her husband, she went to Chillocca. And then the two boys...

(Did they go to school there? I think they went a littlw while here...So...)

After they all got in high school, they all went to school, then I moved out here. Been livin' here ever since.

(What do you'have, five children?)

No, four...three boys and one girl. 'Course Earl has been - he lived in Colorado. Irvin was in the Navy, and Bernice was goin' to Chilloco all this time. And I just didn't - just my mother and I lived here - for a long time.
