I forget whether it was Iowa or some other part of the states up there that didn't want them. They drove 'em on down here.

(And they settled them all up there in--)

Six miles wide, strip down through from Kansas line down to Nowata. That was their territory. Took in Nowata. Nowata is--what they call that at that time? Agency.

(Yeah, Nowata is a Delaware word I found out. It means Welcome in the Delaware language.)

So that's how come the Delaware is in there. They was drove in there. And might as well say they told the Cherokees to take care of them, they are a red race of people just like you. They didn't have no alternative, just told them to take care of them.
