We have also done quite a bit of dialogue for style shows to be presented in other parts of the country. And I have written up articles to go along with a program on Indian dress for a folklore club in Indianapolis. And it is something all the time in this field. It is very challenging thing and naturally we want to present it to the public with authenticity, with dignity, and it is with pride that we always want to do this. I think that that's all that I would like to comment on in regard to the business that I am a part of.

#### ACTIVITIES IN INDIAN AFFAIRS AND WOMEN'S CLUBS

I have not only served on the Governor's Interstate Indian Council, but I have been active in the National Congress of the American Indian. And this work has been definitely an asset to me in better understanding Indian people all over the country, Indian issues, Indian legislation, and Indian needs.
