then the old rifle, then they made a pistol. And it was too slow, so they got to making other iron gun. That away they took care that, you know, Belle Star had her lookout up here on the mountain where she'd watch for these passenger trains and watch for the stagecoaches and so, there was a lot of that going on.

(Ft. Gibson?)

That's where they had their guards (U.S.) posted, the guards to guard the different. . . .National guard, to try to watch the people, keep 'em livin'. Oh, there was bands of them outlaws that would go across the country and take what they wanted and what they didn't. Take from the rich and give to the poor. And so they was all just compelled to do what they done because there was people that was before 'em that went up and took whatever they wanted and so, these fellows just decided they'd take from them and give to the people that they had took from. That was, well Corbetts—they had a reason for fighting back. And so, these railroads would just go through and they'd pay you so much or offer you so much, and they'd just run their railroads where they want to and they'd move your house or burn your house, or whatever, that was necessary. And so these people decided that they was certain amount of them that decided that they'd just stop that. And that's the reason—
