No sir, not that I know of. There's a good many of the Shoals a back down east of here.

Third Voice: Well, that's what I was thinking about.

Yes sir, I imagine that was it, you know, down to Harris down in there, south of Idabel, you know, on Red River, Idabel, is there now--It's on south of Idabel, you know, we had a good many kin folks all around in there, Harris Springs and different places. See, after we was free, why, they--I guess they scattered up. Yes sir, first one place and then another.

(Where were your mother and daddy born?)

I just really couldn't tell you. I guess they was freed right up there. But now for where they were born, that I couldn't tell you. But they told me they was freed right up here on the Lake-west farm. I knowed pretty well--I seen some of the old barn there, after, you know, they was free, but I never did see the houses. That was way back yonder.

(They may have--they may have been moved here from Mississippi, maybe, or Alabama, wonder?)
