Ox was gone way up awhile, then they'd come back, empty wagon, he'd go back and load it up again. Went down to cuttin' wood, why, he'd haul wood there--

(After the mission was built--now, Dave McIntosh used to haul wood there too?)

Yeah, he helped along with *umin.), you see I was just 2 year old, he was married, then he had to get out and work--

First cousin that's right--Mother's niece.

(Well, what was your mother's maiden name?)

Dennis.

(Dennis, oh, well, that's a well-known name--what was her father's name, do you remember his first name?)

I don't remember his name--she was a Dennis. Her brother was named John Dennis. Seems like she originated from, supposed to have been a Bowleg, Dennis Bowleg taked the last name and give them Dennis, you see. She was Dennis Bowleg is what she's supposed to be named.
