-- they went to school with the blanket and long hair and earrings. I think I told you about that.

(Well, before that, had he ever gone out to war or had he done any fighting with the Kiowas?)

He may. He may, but that's before my time.

(I just wondered if you ever heard about it?)

Well, I just tell you about what I know about him. The government had a -- in front of the Agency -- they had about a five acre pasture full of deers.

(Full of what?)

Deers. Under about the six foot woven, heavy woven fence. And Boinadle had to care for those deers and feed them. Boinadle feeds those deers every day and he is government janitor and sweeps out the office and clean up. And he lives in his wagon down on the river about half a mile from the Agency. His wagon standing under a large cottonwood tree and back of his wagon he's got his cupboard and he had his fireplace where he cooks. And it was west of one of the trader's stores about three or four hundred yards--"Sé.n'pa zé dl bèh" store.

EARLY ANADARKO

Sé.n pa ze dl beh--"Terrible Beard."

(All right, would you say that again?)

Se.n pa ze dl beh. It means terrible beard. It means beard all over the face. Women think it's terrible (referring to the fact that Kiowas do not like beards--j.j.).

(How do you say beard?)

Beard? sen pah...

(How do you say terrible?)
