- β = b + v sound (bilabial fricative)
- e = ay
- ɛ = eh
- β = p + v sound
- i = ee
- ʌ = u, as in shut
- ɽ = a "flapped" r
- o = oh
- ə = uh, as in alone
- ʈ = dental "t"
- u = u, as in you
- ʉ = u; eh (extremely deep in throat)
- h = aspiration
- ˈ = stress
- ʁ = glottal stop
- ˑ = when letters are terminally upper cased it means they are lightly voiced.
- ː = lengthening of preceding sound
