(They were bootleggin' whiskey from Missouri, huh?)

Yeah. Southwest City, mostly.

(Had to carry a gun when you was freighting?)

Yeah. When I was freighting, I always carried little pop. I never did have to use it.

(Did you have a four horse team on your --)

No, just two horse. I just haul what one team could handle.

(Yeah. Roads was rough, I guess.)

I'd say they was rough, and winding. Wasn't no such a thing as a highway. Back them times, we got over there at Flint Creek had to go up the creek and way on up to the Red Bluff, and then cross, and up the hill, and around.

(Was there many people living out in that country then or Rose Prairie?)
Well, yeah, quite a few. They was kinda mixed up, whites and Indians.
Wasn't near as many whites. 'Course, change around and the whites has bought most of them Indians out.

(name not clear) one of the old settlers there. They livin' on part of his dad's old place. His dad, when I went there, was a postmaster down...
