Now I would like to ask that the leader of the 45th (name not clear)-- be ready for it in just a minute we are looking forward in hearing from you again. While they are making their way up here, I have a few announcements I would like to pass on to you at this time. So by all means, please, include this in your activities for today. This is the arts and crafts show down at the armory building the art show in the college union building, the new college building. I think you'll find ample parking up there today, so by all means you are encouraged to visit both of these shows.
