We of our nation. must realize that with the youth ranks the fate of our nation. / Mr. Glass is most interested with these boys in baseball. There can be a great career for good baseball players in the major leagues and in the minor leagues. gies'the boys something to do. If your going to tempt them it gives them security and good leadership and it teaches them how to get along with people, it's one of the greatest programs among young people of our area here today, and as you all know, any Indian can play a little baseball.
