Had more to do with and we can dnjoy ourselves in more different ways.
In them days, we had to walk. And we couldn't go too far to do anything, you know, like you can now. Now; you can jump up here and go to Tenkiller fishin'. And otherwise, a workin' man. was more thought of then. Now--then, see, I.only got $\$ 2.50$ a week for workin' for people: And then, I'd get opút and cut ties timber and charge a penny a tie, cuttin' those ties, you know. And sometimes; I'd cut three or four hundred a week. Go from one to the other and make $\$ 3.00$ or $\$ 4.00 a^{\prime \prime}$ week that way. But that was work now. It wasn't no--there's not another kid, I don't believe, in the state of Oklahoma, who'd go through that. For that was night down in them canyons where it was hot. And Boy, I'm tellin' you it was miserable.
(Working man, today, had got a little more adyantage' hasn't he?)
Oh, a lot more: Why they make more in a hour than I did in a week back then.
(Of course you bought $\dot{a}$ ilot more, like that slab of bacon you ougnit.) Yeah. \$2.50--a man passed right nere a wile ago, paid me $\$ 2.50$ a. wee to work for 'im, That's 50 cents a day and thet-and you didn't stand around like they do now. Boy, you worked. Yeah, you worked. (And you worked till after dark.)

But it was hard for than man to get that 50 cents a day as it was for you to --he had to watych where he was patin his. 50 cents in. (End of Tape)
