(Where did Saddleblanket and his family camp?)

Over there. (At Boone?) No, they're camped down at Hatchetville. Yeah, they camped 'round Hatchetville, somewheres down there by the creek.

(Did anybody camp with them?)

Yeah, there's bunch of them. (Do you remember any of them?) Well, there was Louise's folks and her aunt and you know this Ernest White's folks--and there's bunch of them. I don't know them others but I know there's 'bout three or four families all stay together.

(What was Louise's aunt's name?)

Saddleblanket. *lā ō é l'zè ō é h* (What does that mean?) Saddleblanket.

(What was her dad's name?)

Well, that's it.

(Well, what about her aunt?)

Let's see now-- *mī. ō ā.*

(Did *mī. ō ā.* have any children?)

Well, she had sons but they're all gone.

(Was she Louise's mother's sister?)

No, her daddy's sister. Yeah, that was her daddy's sister.

(Where was Apache Ben back in those days? Where were his folks?)

Well, they all was down there Washita. And I don't know that bunch too good. Since when their old people die out, Ben and Molly and Blanche and all them--they all came this way. And they been staying around Boone. But they used to stay around Cyril somewheres--Little Washita. They used to live 'round there. But since the old people die out they all came 'round Boone and they been staying 'round Boone all the time, now.
