Yeah, then put shot. And you use paper, once in a while.

(And they really killed stuff?)

Yeah. One time we shot a squirrel out of that old tree. They killed that squirrel and that paper was all over that tree.

(They just plastered that tree with paper) (much laughter)

Yes. Paper all over that tree. His name was Alvie Robertson.

(Well. Alvie Robertson?)

Yeah.

(Later on after the muzzle loader faze of shotgun, that got that regular kind of shotgun with shells. Old black powder shells?)

Yeah. We went to Saline one day. He bought me one of them 22 shotguns. I think it was a 16 loader, brand new one. If you bought it now it would cost \$100.00. That was the best shootin' gun I ever had.

(Yeah back in those days you could buy stuff pretty reasonable.)

Yeah. Horses then was about \$25 a head, and could get a good steer for \$15 and hogs maybe \$2.00 a head.

(Didn't need many clothes, just overalls, good shoes.)

And have buckle shoes, you know have buckle on 'em. They said---(Yeah, they were (word not clear). And the children all wore button shoes on the side.)

Yeah, like the old women wear. They still had button shoes.

(Yeah. I've seen pictures of 'em.)

Yeah and some had brass toe.

(Yeah, they had some kind of hook in there and fasten them up.)
