

for dinner. We have all day services and we just stay there and we have lunch there at noon and then we--everybody just stay there and then in the afternoon we have another service.

(Did you, in the afternoon, did you do some more preaching?)

I preach Sunday eleven o'clock and then in night service at seven o'clock--the night service. And then on Wednesday night we had prayer meetings and I preach there too. Three times that is, Sunday at eleven, and then in the evenings, seven-thirty, and then in the prayer meeting on Wednesday night--prayer meeting.

(Well, what went on on Sunday afternoon? Who would preach then?)

Jenny: We had all day service.

We have all day service. Of course, sometimes I preach in the morning and this other preacher, we let him preach. Or if there--nobody there then I preach all day.

(Was that hard to do?)

Oh, my, I'll say it is. But after you got team and you got to drive back about six or seven miles or ten, twelve or twenty miles. You have to make a (unintelligible). But I preach Sunday morning and if I got a visiting preacher from some other church, why, I let him preach and if there is no other, then I preach all day and then in the night. That's hard work.

(Did you have visiting preachers very often?)

Yes, sometimes we exchange preachers. Now--like if I go to Mt. Scott Church and that Mt. Scott preacher come here, or if I go to Lone Wolf Church, that Lone Wolf preacher come over here. Just exchange, you know. But that don't happen about once a year, you know. They let us change.

(Well, these visiting preachers--were they Indian preachers?)
