Church and so on. Sometimes we on a circuit. We have two churches, two churches—from Carnegie to way down in Mt. Scott and I go there for service all day and pretty near half of the night. On a car, though, you see, but when I get a flat it's not a funny thing.

(I bet it's not.)

Jenny: Stecker, you had Stecker.

Oh, yes, Stecker-Stecker Church.

(Well, now, when you had the Mt. Scott Church, did you still live here?)

Yes.

Jenny: Well, we built this home. This home is about forty-nine years old--this home we have. And we left it and so we move.

We move to the parsonage.

Jenny: In a parsonage and like that. We was glad to.

See, where they got a parsonage, where they got a parsonage like Mt. Scott, well, we mover over there. We have to, that's our law. We move over there in that parsonage and leave this home. Not open like this. We have maybe someone to live in it or take care of it for us and then next year maybe they send us to Cache Creek five miles from here. We come back home. Then next year they send us to Hobart. Then we go over there or we go to over to Lone Wolf Church over here. They got a parsonage. We go there and live over there.

(Where is that Lone Wolf?)

Lone Wolf Church is south of Mountain View.

Jenny: Rainy Mountain--close to Rainy Mountain.

It's all old church too.

(Well did you live here when you were preaching at that Mulkehay Church?)
