BEING A CIRCUIT PREACHER WAS MUCH HARDER WORK

(What do you mean by this circuit?)

Circuit, it means that you got two churches. Here's Mt. Scott and here's Carnegie. You on that circuit--you go to church Mt. Scott and then you jump over here at Carnegie. You preside in both churches. That's circuit.

(Would that be on the same day?)

Same, yeah. The Sunday meetings are on the same day. But the prayer meetings are on separate days.

(Well, if you had to preach the same day at both churches, how would you do it?)

If I preach at Mt. Scott Church Sunday morning, then I don't preach there next Sunday morning. I go to the Mulkehay Church. Next Sunday I go back to Mt. Scott. Next Sunday I go back to Mulkehay. It's like that.

(I see, then you don't go to the same church on the same day.)

The same church on Sunday, no. On the Wednesday meeting, on the

Woman's Society of Christian Service Work, we have it on Wednesday

over here at Mt. Scott and on Tuesday we have it over here and that's

the way we have to make it change so you could—. You can't be there

at the same time. You got to be there certain place.

(Did your assistant pastors get any pay for their help?)

No, not til they become a real appointment. But they sometimes get what they call advance, advance special. Sometimes the Mission Board have a little more money and maybe they sent \$50 to their assistant pastor just to help out.

(Were you ever an assistant pastor?)
