RESERVATIONS

(Were there any other Mescaleros that came from New Mexico that settled here?)

Cecil: No, not at that time. They was the first ones. That's a little better than 680 miles. Well now, I take it back. There was prisoners that came to Fort Sill. Geronimo and all his band of Mescalero Apaches were at Fort Sill in 1871. I know that cause it gives it--there is a big museum there and they've got all this history. And that's when Geronimo brought his--all the prisoners from Mescalero reservation after they capture him over there. And then they brought him here and then from here they sent them on to Florida. That's as far as I know.

(I meant were there any others that just came because they wanted to, you know, like Chibato?)

Cecil: Yes, there's another one--Asegonah. Asegonah came from. And there's another one, but I don't know his name. They's several of them came from that there reservation to the Comanches, but we'll have to find that out.

(Can you tell me any more about this Asegonoh?)

Cecil: Asegonoh? Now, I don't know his wife, because he wasn't married when I got acquainted with him. He's another peyote leader. Mostly all of them, when they come, they were all working as medicine men. They come from in them mountains over there, over there in New Mexico. They're Mescaleros. Say, by the way, you gonna go?

(Yes, I am.)
