

Cecil: Well, you'll find out. You'll find out a whole lot.

(That's one reason I'm interested in talking about this subject today, because I would like to learn a little more about it. But how come all the Mescaleros that came out here were medicine men?)

Cecil: Well, a Mescalero people told me, one of the leaders, that they were driving all the witches out as much as they can and killing them. All the witches, you know, in that reservation, because they were killing lots of the young men. They were jealous of them and they were witching them and killing lots of them, so they had to get rid of lots of these witch people that used to be in that reservation. That's what they done here too, but of course, they didn't. They tried to witch each other, you know, and kill each other. If they didn't witch the one, they might witch one of the daughters or the son or something like that, just to bring up trouble.

(Do you remember the name of that Mescalero leader that told you that?)

Cecil: There are two. Now, he's (pause and speaks to Jennie)-- you know, the one I sing for, you know.

Jenny: Oh, which one? (speaks Kiowa)

Cecil: Where we used to camp and I go there.

Jenny: His name is Willie. I know his first name is Willie, old man. I forgot all the names. Woodrow, Woodrow, I don't know if Woodrow's still living.

(What's Woodrow's last name?)

Jenny: Woodrow Wilson, Willie Wilson, I think is his name, Willie Wilson. Woodrow Wilson.

Cecil: Yeah, no.
