go over there himself and his father-in-law had to go and talk for himself. When everything was all right and he brought him over there.

(Did this happen before the country opened up?)

Jenny: Yeah. Yeah, it's way back there before the country opened up. (speaks Kiowa)

Cecil: That was before they were allotted. The government, well, opened up the country. It wasn't, it was still, well, there wasn't any reservation yet.

Jenny: Maybe Cecil wasn't born yet.

Cecil: I wasn't, no. I wasn't born yet. I was born 1891. It happened further back.

Jenny: Tonakout was married to Old Man Hunting Horse's first daughter and they were just, he was just a young man. This Tonakout was-just a young man.

Cecil: He was married to that one when he killed, and I wasn't even born yet.

Jenny: (speaks Kiowa)

Cecil: That's right. What was her name?

Jenny: Agog'Èháipau

Cecil: `Her name was Agóg'≩háipau.

HUNTING HORSE'S FIRST DAUGHTER WAS NAMED PRINCESS

Jenny: The Princess of the family always have an elk teeth dress. (What do you mean by Princess?)

Cecil: Of all the Kiowa tribe, she was picked as one of the Princesses of all the tribe.

Jenny: Highly respected girl.

Cecil: She was highly respected. My father--whatever she said--
