Jenny: Yeah, the whole relatives of the family and it's all her lifetime that she was Princess in the family and all the relatives. And the other peoples all respect her. The old man (Tónakout) got her the best of everything. She had a riding horse. She had everything she wishes.

(Was there more than one Princess in the tribe at one time?)

Jenny: Well, I don't know. In other families--but I just know about--maybe there was.

(Was there one in your family?)

Jenny: Well, no, I don't know. I never heard.

Cecil: He was in the 14th Cavalry. He was in the Army up there at Fort Sill under General Scott.

Jenny: And when his sister passed away. She died young. She died when she was giving childbirth.

(This girl?)

Jenny: Yeah, Audemáton. She died when she was giving birth to her first baby. And then they, in her place, they made one of the sisters marry her husband. Not that day, but later, maybe three or four years later.

(Well, would she be considered Audemáton even after she married?)
