Pack tells that when living at Hungry Mountain on a place he had bought from Buffalo Christie, he was away for a while. While gone, someone burnt his home, along with two other nearby places. He still vows he will find the guilty person.

He says that his the early days people did not have storm cellars, and that he only recalls one cyclone in the country up until recent years.

He tells of his folks putting up their food stuffs for winter use, and packing and smoking meat.

At one time he worked with a turkey and deer trapping crew, taking game for restocking what is now the Cookson Hills Game refuge.

Mr. Pack is an old man living on the Josie McFire place close by Welling, and enjoys the peace and quite there in his senior years.
