where that tipi was and that's where he was born. They didn't used to go to hospitals.

Cecil: But they got the record of my birth-mark. But they don't know what year.

Jenny: NO! They know the year, but the date.

Cecil: I mean they know the year but not the date. But that Fort Sill was established in 1871, I believe. That's when my father was a scout.

(I'd like to bring you this calendar. I've just got it borrowed.

It's not mine but I'd like you to see it. Maybe you'd know some

of the things on it.)

Jenny: We saw several of them on--(speaks Kiowa)

Cecil: Oh, yeah. J. L. Moody's got that.

Jenny: But that's a real one.

Cecil: That's a real one.

(Who's got it?)

Jenny: Who's got it?

Cecil: I don't know who's got it now because the only one that I know--that J.L. Moody in Washington, D.C. got it.

(Oh, yeah. Uh-huh.)

Cecil: He's got that calendar:

(That calendar history, yeah.)

Cecil: But now Guy came and he told me about it, but it was lost.

They claimed, I don't know, somebody went and borrowed some money on it. At Kelly's at Carnegie, you know, when he was running a grocery store. Well, they went back after it and they couldn't find it. It was just a big roll of canvas. I guess you saw canvas, you now about that—that roll. So they couldn't find it to this day. Why
