(Granddaughter: So this woman says, "Don't send me over there.)

She (the favored girl) said, "I stay here." But you know how them girls are--they want to have fun. They already got her going on, breaking the rule and standing down there on the ground. They don't care, them girls. They said, "You can play, too." And this girl, "No, no, it's against my medicine rule. I can't play that way." So, anyhow they urge her and make her go. So she went. When she gets down there, she chase her. She pick up sand, and he chased her. And she told her sister, she said, "Sister, I told you, but you wouldn't do it. You wouldn't mind." She said, "Now, (when) I run on the fourth one," she said, "You must run your best. And run for home. Get into the little dog house. Go in there," she said, "Go in and lay down in there." So she chase them that way, back and forth. Second time. Third time. And fourth time, she catch one of them girls and she screamed. That girl became a bear. She come around and she break one of these girl's
