(Starts with singing and lasts for 3 minutes. There is much background noise.) Wallace Redbone: We have the dancing until midnight here (not clear). We have this special song on behalf of these 3 little ones here. This is the first time they have danced and also her brother here, Emmett who has dedicated the staff here for the tribe. Makes her feel good that they have a part in this program and also Emmett here says, "Year ago, I was in no shape to walk. They told me' that they might have to take my leg off, when somebody's prayer was answered. Thank-goodness for that." He says that Someone was thoughtful. That today, I can walk and I dedicated one of the staffs. I looked forward to that. Today I am able to walk. I am able to get around. I am able to get around, my health has come back. For the many things I am thankful for today, that I pledge my word today." But he says, "Above all, I am thankful." This is Lee Motah. Lee Motah: We have a new song. All right! Everybody dance--you are coming You are coming up. (Song starts and lasts for 5 minutes.) Wallace: Now gentlemen, I have went around and talked to the different individuals about their specials. So we are going to combine the White Cloud special and the Bohay special, Henry Kasuda special in this next special altogether. That will wind up our specials for this afternoon. Before we have the song,

Mr. Hudson: Wallace, Frank, Fred, Amos, the Headsmen of Society and the members. I want to say a word or two and express how the (not clear) white has feel towards this organization honoring this young grandson of ours to be your head dancer. We are awful proud of it and we want to thank you peoples that you thought about this young man. He is new into this--young, and this might encourage him to go on. We teach him, try to tell him lot of things--respect. And we ask this Blackfeet Society that wherever they may see different organizations, differens mens, that they might give this young man a good word that they might carry on. To try to be some help in this way. This is the way he likes--the dancing. His great great grandfather was a big man in this
