We've got individuals here from almost every organization that goes on in this area and I -- some of you **probably** don't know OIO, so we ought to have someone in OIO that we can use in our program. There'll be parts of Boyce's program that can be used for the Indians of this area -- Community Action can be used in various aspects. These things we need to bring together in here, see what the possibilities are and work with an objective everytime, with the idea of furthering ourselves in the community.
