And if one boy hits this then he win. Game wheel, I think they call it. It's a playing game with a wheel. And I think that's what they call it. And it's painted red--the wheels. This here, it's all rawhide. The wheels is made out of wood but all of this here is made out of rawhide. It's strips like this. And how they do--they put those on so it can run straight. It couldn't run this way, you know. It run straight. That's why they put them weight, I guess.
