(What was the Wichita woman's name?)

Cecil: I don't know her name but I heard that story many, many times.

(You know, you were saying that this old witch woman lived off by herself. You know they used to live off by themselves. How was that?)

Jenny: Well, maybe you read in a Bible that—a story book about that the witch woman. In our tribe, we call the witch woman a bad medicine woman. They eat certain things. There are some certain things that they are not allowed to eat. And it's kind of dangerous because sometimes when they sit down to eat—you ain't dare to pass back over there cause she's gonna witch you. You might even fall, fall and just black out. Go ahead.
