And I got that and it's very good. It's pretty good stories she tells. She does good work. (Cecil and Jenny discuss in Kiowa)

That's where he get it.

(Anyway, I was wondering if you knew any more about those lodges? Like the Elk Lodge and the Gourd Lodge?)

Jenny: And Blackfeet.

(And Blackfeet, yes?)

Jenny: I said maybe they sure enough got black feet. They don't wash their feet.

Cecil: I been to--I know where that place is. That's where the Wichitas first land. I think she's been there to the mountains. They were right in there. There's a river. You can't get up to
