And I shot at that turkey and never did hit it though of course. I just laid may gun down and got me a rock. And I hit that turkey right on the head with the first blow, knocked him over. (Laughter) I used to be awful good with rocks. And every winter those eagles would sit on that dead tree. I saw him kill two eagles from that tree. And that was a long shot, too. He's still got that gun, too.
