(Yeah. I wonder how it got its name. It would be interesting to find out.) See George's boy taught school there, two or three years. You know. (Sentence not clear.) Mrs. Payne: I did have. I wouldn't know where to find it. (Inaudible--static) EARLY DAY FARMING - TOWNS OF DUPREE; GORE, AND AFTON (Leonard, where were you raised?) Dupree (And-you seen that country grow up there too, haven't you?) You mean up here. (Yeah) Yeah, I seen it grow. Where we lived between Vinita/and Bluejacket (Yeah) Where dad's place used to be. Uh-huh. That's about east of us. (Up in hab Timbered Hill--) No just south. (Just south & Timbered Hill.) Timbered Hill--Yeah--About three or four mile. (Uh-huh) Mrs. Payne: I grew up about half way between Gore and Afton. (Uh-huh) \(not clear) Mrs. Payne: (Yeah but I notice there at Afton this past summer the amount of grain that was being hauled in there. And I believe there's more farming around Afton than anyplace I've seen.) Yeah. (Uh, was it like that in the early days, too?) Mrs. Payne: Yes, they used to raise even more grain than they do now, They

had more corn, oats, and wheat.

(Uh-huh)
