

Dog Creek begins up in Nowata County and runs down thru Rogers County. This stream is mentioned many times by Indians who have lived along its winding route. At one time the Coo-wee-scoo-wee District Court House was on Dog Creek, as were some of the old schools. Dog Creek runs about a mile west of Mr. Ragsdale's home and has figured much in the lives of early day Indians.

Mr. Ragsdale says that up until a few years ago many Indians raised tobacco in the hill country of this part of Rogers County, and the crop was of excellent quality. It was home cured and twisted or cut for their own use.

At one time sugar cane was an important crop to the Indians. Each family would have a small patch of sugar cane. In late summer the cane would be cut and sorghum molasses made for winter use. This too has become a lost art among the Indians.
