т-346-2 or something like that. And you know different land and different trees. And different kinds of people, different ways of living. So they had to add some things and change some things maybe to fit their needs for that time.) Yes there's just lot of things that you can study adout. The more you study about seems like more interesting it gets. Cause art and crafts. Cherokee arts and crafts. (Well) Down here in this end of our hollow. We organized a group. (Well) Oh it went on for about, oh about six or seven months I guess. (Uh-huh) And we didn't have nobody to talk to, to us about it. (Yeah) And we started. And finally, oh that Cherokee new president, from Tahlequah, you know. Crossland Smith. (Oh yeah. Crossland Smith.) And he come out here. And he organized a group. You know represent us from this community. And I'm one of the representatives. (Uh-huh) And another man name of Jackson McClain. He's headman. I'm under him someway. (Uh-huh)

He's the man, I'm under him. So we go to this meeting here about once a month. Here at this Cherokee meeting. And finally they come along after we organized. They told us you can do anything you want to. If you ask for it. And we just studied and studied. We have a meeting, have a business meeting. No one brought a thing out that would be interesting. So finally I went over
