(Uh-huh)

And white man lives and grows. That's how he come. You don't know how much money he got today.

(Well, yeah.)

Has lots of cattle. Lots of land. He come here with just one britches

TRAVEL BY FOOT, WAGON, OR HORSEBACK IN EARLY DAYS

(Well how did they travel around when you was young fellow?)

In a wagon.

(Just in a wagon.)

Horse back. 4

(Horse and wagon.)

Some go on foot. Covered wagon. People go twenty miles to go to church, wagon.
