Yeah.

(And after his lease expired, you all moved in?)

Moved in, yes.

(Then where did you live before you moved there?)

We was all around that place, camped. We live in a tent.

(How about tipis, did anybody live in a tipi, then?)

No.

(Was your tent realy big that you lived in?)

Oh, Just a tent like you see, you know. Pretty good sized--say, about six or seven strips. Bome of them are five, strips.

## BOKE'S STORE IN ANADARKO

Back in those days, when they used tents like that—did they ever make those tents themselves or did they buy them ready made or have them made?)

Well, I never did know of my mother making a tent. She could, I guess, but I never heard no—they bought a tent here in Anadarko. There used to be a man—they got that sign that says, "Roberts T.V."? That man used to have all Indian stuff like tents and hardware, and processes—all combined.

You can go in there and buy your hardware and processes and buy your material. ile's got dry goods and hardware and processes—thises like that. All in one store.

(That's that Roberts' Store?)

Yeah. That used to be A.B.C. Store, they called it.

(Was Roberts running it?)

No, no. The people that ran it are all dead.

Boke's.

(Didn't he have another store down there by Rainy Mountain?)
