(Did you like Cache Creek better than St. Patrick's or vice versa?)

Well, I liked this up here better than I did Cache Creek Mission. Only reason I didn't like it over there, you couldn't play on Sundays. But here they let us play on Sundays.

(Then how did you come to go to Rainy Mountain school?)

Well, my folks took me up there. Put me up there. I didn't like the school. Oh, it's all right, but I didn't like it myself. I went there just half a year. Come home for Christmas and I didn't go back.

(It was a boarding school, too, wasn't it?)

Yeah, just like Riverside School. That's what it was. Government school.

(When you were going to Rainy Mountain, were there any other Apaches going there?)

Well, there's two girls--my oldest niece, and my cousin. Marie and Mabel High.

(How many years of school did you have all together?)

I don't know. I went to school for months and I never learned nothing.

(Oh I bet you learned something!)
