all them cows and stuff like that because we got to move. We move down there by Broxton.

(Did your son inherit that place from your dad?)
Yeah.

(Your place down at Broxton--there was already a house there, wasn't there?)

No. Well, there was, till they tore it down. But I live in that house on

my sister's place.

(Did you all ever have a garden or anything out there?)

No, we didn't have a garden out there. What time we was living there we never did plant no garden. That place down there belongs to me now. I bought an acre and a half. I bought it.

(Are you thinking about moving out there?)

Oh no. I was thinking about my granddaughter, but I don't see how they can move out there. Not the way they're doing. Her husband, I don't know where he's at now. We take him down to Hobart the other day. They're not living together like they should. He drinks too much. That's what he was doing, I guess, when he left. I don't know where he's at today.
