A-IV ~**T-35**3 catches down in there and you light that. Oh, the globe lamps was the late things. (Well.) Well I remember we had a little music machine. (Son: It was a little old machine.) Gramaphones wasn't it? (Gramaphones, yeah.)

Yeah.

(Now that was the first recording instrument that came out, I guess.)

Yes.

Round records. Round and round---

(Yeah, round records.)

(Son: Yeah, I remember one of those. We had one when I was a kid.) It had a big old horn.

(Yes.)

A big round horn in it. Speaker, it was called. It would speak out loud. (Well, now that was quite a thing, I guess, in them days.)

Yes it sure was.

(Yeah, you were really up in the world if you owned one of those.)

(Son: Well, they used--back before they used kerosene up here, it's what they call a tallow lamp. Didn't use kerosene.)

Now that was a candle. Candles. We didn't make 'em, but grandmother used to make them. But we never did.

(What was the materials made out of?)

The tallow candle? Well, it was made--you put beef fat and rend it out. You know it makes a hard solid stuff. And they put a wick in of some kind of a coarse thread. Through the center. And wrap that you know. Cover it up. And make it any shape you wanted.
