This is something else. This is -- .

(Well did the Indians have separate graveyards also?)

Frank: Mostly. Yeah, they the Indians just kinda had their own graveyards.

Now there is one out west of here. Over here by, about a mile or little

over. And they buried there. And then you got up to Spring Creek there was

several places up Spring Creek where they buried.

Molly: We have a graveyard.

Frank: And where she was raised, on her place was another graveyard.

(Well.)

Quite a few buried there.

(Does this place, graveyard have a name?)

No. ·

Molly: Yeah, ours has, Terrapin.

Frank: Yeah, Terrapin Graveyard, I guess.

Molly: That's my grandmothers.

Frank: There's an Indian graveyard west of Fox's store down there. By the name of Tom Kelner Graveyard. And then right east of Fox's store. There's one called Swimmer. It's about the, I guess about the oldest of the graveyards you can find. It's been there years and years. And they still bury there.

It's kept up.

(Uh-huh.)

Molly: That's where this here fellow he went and seen that Andy Crittendem.

(Yeah.)

Yeah there's where all his -- .

Molly: I guess his great-grandmother, his daddy and mother is all buried there. His daddy died not too long ago and he was ninety something.

(Uh-huh.)
