(Around Miami and Quapaw and--)

Oh, Miami and through there. He's original from Quapaw and Miami and he's Quapaw Tribe. He later--I understand that he brought--he was a--what would you call him--Preacher--ordained.

(He was ordained by John Wilson.)

Yeah. Ordained by John Wilson and brought churches over here for the Osages and these peyote meetings. That's not from 'round here. Then I have a picture here of Mrs. Pearl Buffalo and her daughter (28)--I think that's Beulah--and my sister name Eva Bean, she was from here. And I have a picture here--I have picture here, of Mrs. Watson from Gray Horse (29). And Mrs. Blackbird from Gray Horse (29). And I do not know their parents name. And I have a picture here of one of my cousins. His name was Louis Hoke-ashe and his wife, Ruby (30). Used to be Ruby Big Chief. And I have another picture here of--have an old picture here--these ladies here. There's two ladies and a young woman and three children. The first lady was Mrs., Mrs.--I just can't hardly--trying to think of her name. Anyway,
